80 percent of sexual assaults are committed by someone you know. An acquaintance, a neighbor, or someone who you have encountered at some past time may become your assailant. Perhaps they have been watching you. Perhaps they just got up the courage to make that perverse move. What ever the reason, acquaintance rape is the most common threat women are faced with.

It happens everyday. An ex-boyfriend goes out and is drinking too much. He asks you if he can come over because he wants to talk. He is acting nervous. He is speaking irritably. Do you let him in? Something is telling you not to because something does not "feel right". You should pay attention to that feeling, that insight. One of the most important things to remember and utilize in avoidance techniques is **INTUITION!** Intuition is a powerful subconscious tool giving insight into people and situations. Avoid a situation that does not "feel right" you are probably correct!

"Sexual assault occurs most commonly among women in late adolescence and early adulthood, (Crowell and Burgess 1996). Most sexual assaults that are reported to the police occur between strangers. These assaults, however, represent only a small proportion of all sexual assaults. At least 80 percent of sexual assaults occur among persons who know each other." (Crowell and Burgess 1996).

In a survey of more than 6,000 students at 32 colleges and universities in the U.S., it was found that:

- One in four women had been victims of rape
- or attempted rape;
- 84% of the rape victims knew their attacker;
- 57% of the rapes happened on dates;
- Only 27% of the women considered
- themselves to be victims of rape, although
- their assaults met the legal definition of rape;
- 42% of the rape victims told no one of the
- assault, and only 5% reported it to the
- police;
- College aged women are the women most vulnerable to acquaintance rape. Boyfriends, friends and acquaintances of the victim commit the vast majority of sexual assaults on a college campus.

"The typical party rape occurs at an off-campus house or on- or off-campus fraternity and involves the offender's playing a woman with alcohol or targeting an intoxicated woman. Environmental factors that could facilitate the rape include easy access to alcohol, availability of a private room, loud music that drowns out the woman's calls, and, potentially, a cover-up by the house's residents, who may choose to maintain group secrecy over reporting the rape. By contrast, a date rape typically involves two people who are just becoming acquainted, and the offender rapes the woman in a car or residence after the date." (Problem-Oriented Guides for Police series).

Researchers suggest that educational programs are the most effective acquaintance rape prevention approach. By being aware. By using avoidance techniques. By obtaining skills in self defense. Only then may you have a chance. Only then may you be able to save your own life. Remember: Acquaintance rape is never the victim's fault. It doesn't matter where the victim was or what she was wearing. Rape is always the fault of the offender! If you don't get help from us at HND, then get help somewhere. Learning how to defend yourself is one of the most important things you can do.
