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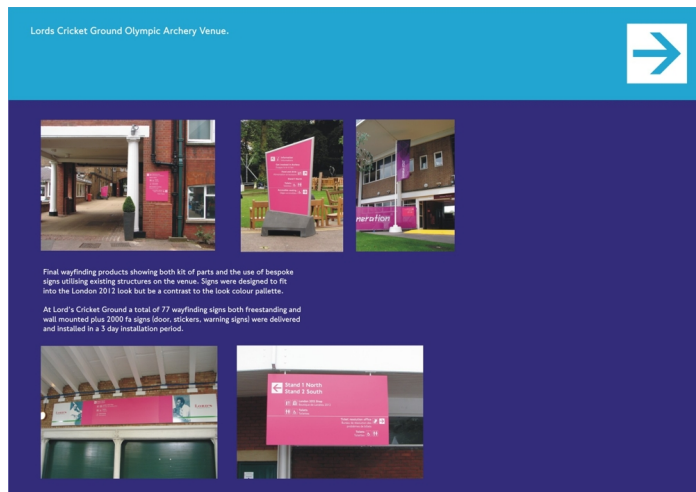
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

Eton Dorney's 2.5 kilometre length made the use of large freestanding products essential. These were placed at key wayfinding points and within line of sight of the next freestanding sign.
